### EVENT PARKING

Parking for the Yuengling 190th Summer Celebration is available in multiple locations in and around the City of Pottsville. Please follow event parking signs when approaching the City or use the provided GPS addresses to guide you in. Locations with free continuous shuttle service are also identified.

We encourage you to utilize the Waze app for updated traffic information when traveling to the event. Route 61 (Claude A Lord Blvd), Route 209, North and South Centre Streets as well as East and West Market Streets will remain open to normal through traffic during the event, however these roads may slow and become congested during the event due to increased traffic.

### CITY STREETS

Street parking is available in and around the downtown area on a limited basis. Parking should occur at any metered location and care should be exercised not to park in restricted areas. There will be no shuttle bus service offered for street parking. Vehicles parking illegally or otherwise dangerously may be towed by order of the Pottsville Police Department.

## 190TH SUMMER CELEBRATION

### ROAD CLOSURES

In order to prepare for the Yuengling 190th Summer Celebration, we are offering the following information on street closures for the event to our neighboring residents and businesses.

Starting Friday July 12 at 6am, portions of selected city streets will be closed in preparation of the Saturday July 13th event. These streets will remain closed until approximately noon on Sunday July 14.

- Laurel Boulevard – From Centre Street to Terry Reiley Way (Access to County Services Building parking lot and Progressive Vision Institute parking lot will be available until close of business)
- Progress Avenue – From East Race Street to the US Postal Facility (Access to Progress Cleaners will be available until close of business. The US Postal Facility and Giant Markets will be accessible from Terry Reiley Way.
- Arch Street Parking Lot – Will be closed.

Starting Saturday, July 13 at 6am, the following streets will be closed for the event and inaccessible to any vehicular traffic. These streets will be opened by approximately 8pm Saturday.

- Mahantango Street – From South 6th Street to South 2nd Street
- South 2nd Street – From Mahantango Street to West Norwegian Street
- North 2nd Street – From West Norwegian Street to West Market Street
- West Norwegian Street – From North Centre Street to South 3rd Street

Starting Saturday, July 13 at 6am, the following streets will be closed for the event and inaccessible to any vehicular traffic. These streets will be opened by approximately 6am Sunday.

- Progress Avenue – From East Norwegian Street to Giant Markets
- Laurel Boulevard – From North Centre Street to Terry Reiley Way
- East Race Street – From North Centre Street to Progress Avenue
- East Arch Street – From North Centre Street to Terry Reiley Way
- East Market Street – From North Centre Street to Progress Avenue
- Capitol Parking Deck – Will be closed. All vehicles must be removed.

Route 61, Route 209, North and South Centre Streets and East and West Market Streets may be congested during the event due to increased traffic in the area, but will remain open to through traffic.
